

LASSO Safety Hazards Policy

Safety is our number one concern for our LASSO Marketplace technicians. Always be aware of your surroundings, by practicing Safety Awareness at each of your events.

Common Hazards:

Live event production presents unique challenges and hazards regardless of specific job functions. Understanding these risks is key to maintaining a safe working environment for all staff.

1. Electrical Hazards:

- Risk of shock, fire, or explosion from improper handling of electrical equipment, faulty wiring, equipment overload.
 - o Positions for risk Audio, Video and Lighting Technicians, Stagehand, Carpenter, Loader/Pusher

2. Physical Hazards:

- Slips, trips, and falls due to cables, equipment, and stage setups.
- Potential for injury from falling objects or collapsing structures.
 - o Positions for risk Audio, Video and Lighting Technicians, Stagehand, Carpenter, Loader/Pusher

3. Noise Exposure:

- Long-term exposure to high decibel levels can lead to hearing impairment.
 - o Positions for risk Audio, Video and Lighting Technicians, Stagehand, Carpenter, Loader/Pusher

4. Work at Heights:

- Risks associated with working on ladders, scaffolding, or elevated platforms.
 - o Positions for risk Audio, Video and Lighting Technicians, Stagehand, Carpenter, Loader/Pusher

5. Workplace Violence:

- Incidents of aggression or violence between coworkers or with the public.
 - Positions for risk Audio, Video and Lighting Technicians, Stagehand, Carpenter, Loader/Pusher

Safety Practices:

1. Electrical Safety

- Always inspect electrical equipment and cords for damage before use.
- Follow proper lockout/tagout procedures when working with powered devices.

2. Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention:

- Keep work areas and walkways clear of hazards.
- Properly secure all cables and use cable covers where pedestrian traffic is present.

3. Hearing Conservation:

- Use appropriate ear protection, such as earplugs or earmuffs, when working near loud sounds.
- Adhere to schedules that limit exposure duration to loud environments.

4. Safe Work at Heights:

- Use fall protection equipment when required and ensure it's in good condition.
- Always follow safety protocols for ladders, scaffolds, and any elevated work areas.

5. Preventing Workplace Violence:

- Attend training on conflict resolution and de-escalation techniques.
- Report any threats or incidents of violence immediately to supervisors or designated safety personnel.

6. General Health and Safety Training:

- Participate in regular safety training sessions to stay informed about the latest safety practices.
- Encourage a culture of safety where employees feel empowered to speak up.
